

This is in regard to the evaluation aspects of your grant application. I am writing to request that within three months of your start date (as noted on the grant award) you provide me with a final and complete evaluation plan developed by Melvin F. Annis and Associates. This should reflect any changes or modifications as a result of Annis having full access to your program plans and previous evaluation scheme for all the areas not covered in the competitive range. At the least, Annis should include the following: 1) provide more detail on what specific procedures will be used for developing and validating the instruments; 2) submit the completed instruments for NIAAA review and approval; 3) address the issue of the problems with in-county controls and how this will be resolved; 4) provide more detail on the specific procedures they plan to use to follow the health status of babies born (i.e., how will they get the self-report data) compared with the general population and literature; and 5) how will they account for other effects such as media messages unrelated to the project. Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions about these matters.

Thank you for all of your effort thus far. I look forward to the contribution which your program will make to the field of the prevention of alcohol related problems and look forward to working with you.

Enclosed, you will find our complete response to your letter of September 8, 1980 to Ms. Patricia MacDonell of NCA-GDA. In order to facilitate the usefulness of our response, we will list the questions you raised and where the precise answers are to be located in the response.

First, you requested "...a final and complete evaluation plan...." The enclosed package provides the entire plan.

You then requested that the following specific information be included:

1. "provide more detail on what specific procedures will be used for developing and validating the instruments." The discussion of control groups begins on page 6 of the Evaluation Plan.
2. "submit the completed instruments for NIAAA review and approval." All instruments are presented as exhibits at the conclusion of the Evaluation Plan.

3. "address the issue of the problems with in-county controls and how this will be resolved." As was indicated in 1. above, two control groups have been established. While the first group, a sample of female students at the University of Michigan does not address the problem of in-county controls, the second group (i.e. non-participating agencies matched to the Recruitment Agencies) should provide adequate control. It is anticipated that these matched agencies will be selected throughout the Tri-county Metropolitan Detroit area. Consequently controls within and without Wayne County will be available.
 4. "provide more detail on the specific procedures they plan to use to follow the health status of babies born...." The discussion on establishing babies health status begins on page 11 of the Evaluation Plan. Additionally, comparative analysis through literature review will be provided as discussed on pages 12-14 of the Evaluation Plan.
 5. "how will they account for other effects such as media messages unrelated to the project." The control groups thus far discussed will measure changes in respondent behavior due to factors other than the actual prevention project. These factors would also include uncontrolled media messages.
